SNAP Issuance Unit in St. Croix Mars Hill Location Resumes In-Person Services

U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS — The Virgin Islands Department of Human Services announced today that they have re-opened the Mars Hill SNAP Issuance Unit as of Wednesday, March 10, 2021 for in-person services after being shut down to protect both staff and clients when they activated their COVID-19 mitigation protocols to address a confirmed COVID-19 case among staff.

DHS staff are continually encouraged to continue to maintain CDC best practices to prevent the spread of COVID-19:

- Wear your mask (covering your nose and mouth while in the workplace)
- Maintain social distance
- Wash your hands with soap for 20 seconds, often
- Wear appropriate other PPE while in contact with other staff or clients
- Use hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol when you cannot wash hands
- Routinely clean and disinfect frequently used surfaces
- Share FACTS not rumors
- Contact your manager, supervisor or administrator if you do not have access to appropriate PPE while at work
